Temporary Visiting Hours



AUGUST 11, 2021

Everyone will be screened (NOT TESTED) for COVID-19 and required to wear simple mask upon entering the hospital. Mask will be discarded upon exit. All visitors must show acceptable proof of vaccination or proof of a negative SARS-CoV-2 test within the last 72 hours.

General Hospital Visiting

- General visiting hours are currently restricted due to the need for social distancing to prevent the spread of COVID-19
- One visitor per day per patient. 8 am to 8 pm
- Visitor must remain in patient room throughout the visit
- No visitors allowed for COVID-19 isolation patients (those pending test results and those testing positive) in any areas of the hospital, unless patient has special circumstances such as end of life

Cardiac Critical Care Unit 3rd floor

- One visitor per day per patient between 8 am to 8 pm unless patient is critical and/or end of life

Labor and Delivery

- One support person may be present during the delivery and post-partum; one support person allowed overnight

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)

- One visitor at a time allowed 24/7

Emergency Department (ED)

- One visitor allowed at the discretion of the lead nurse and physician unless patient is critical and/or end of life

Acute Rehabilitation Unit (ARU)

- One visitor per day per patient. 8 am to 8 pm
- Visitor must remain in patient room throughout the visit

Procedure and Surgical Visitors

- One visitor per day per patient

End of Life

- Exceptions will be granted on all units for a designated support person to visit patients who are approaching end of life. All support persons must show acceptable proof of vaccination or proof of a negative SARS-CoV-2 test within the last 72 hours. Support persons will be screened prior to entering the clinical areas and must stay in the patient's room. Support persons must comply with any health facility instructions on personal protective equipment. Additionally, nursing will encourage patients and families to have frequent video and phone call visits.

Exceptions:

- Visitor of a patient whose death may be imminent
- Parent of a minor child
- Support person of a laboring patient
- Support person of a disabled patient
